IMPROVE YOUR BRIDGE WITH THE ABF'S DAILY COLUMN



President's Report

My phone and email ran hot recently with players complaining about the prize monies awarded at a recent (large) congress. I did, as I always do, explain that congress matters, other than the bridge aspects, are the sole responsibility of the club. So, the best way forward is to contact the club directly, express your disappointment and suggest that you may not play next year.

On a related matter I have been in trouble, mainly from the ever-vigilant John Beddow, for not properly checking congress flyers. It is a requirement that to have congress flyers on the BAWA web site and to use the associated entry facility some statement regarding prize structure be included on the flyer. Details regarding what this should look like can be found on our web site. I am now checking more carefully and will be sending non-compliant flyers back. Congress convenors please take note.

If you are keen to earn some Gold Points then the Restricted/Provincial GNOT heat is being held on Sunday 25 August. It is a one day only event open to ALL players with less than 300 masterpoints or any member of the following four country clubs: Kalgoorlie, Avon, Geraldton and Esperance irrespective of masterpoint status. Also, for Restricted Players is the Gold Point HGR Restricted Swiss Pairs in mid-September. Details for both events can be found on the BAWA web site.

Later in the year there are two further events for Restricted Players both of which I am keen to see succeed. They are the Masters-In-Teams of 3 and the Grand Master – Restricted Pairs. So, make you plans for the Teams of 3 and I will find you a Master to mentor you for the day. Entries are open now on the web site. This year there will be some nice prizes for the winners and runners-up. Our masters can expect a little gift also.

With regard to the Grand Master – Restricted Pairs I have added a link on the flyer which goes straight to the ABF Masterpoint Centre and lists all of the Grand Masters in WA. Not one of them will mind being approached to play. Conversely, should you be a GM, that's Grand Master not Genetically Modified, although I suppose you could be both,

and, you have an upcoming member of your club why not suggest a game?

Vale Sonia "Jimmy" van Dieren

Sonia was such a smiling baby that she acquired the name of 'Sunny Jim' and she was known all of her life as 'Jimmy'. She grew up in West Perth and attended St Hilda's college.

During the Second World War she met Pieter van Dieren, who was in the Dutch navy, and they married in 1945. They lived for many years with their loving family in Caporn Street in Nedlands. A popular couple, both Jimmy and Pieter enjoyed playing bridge and joined the University Bridge Club. In the early 1980's they became founding members of the Village Bridge Club, which was the first non-smoking bridge club in Perth.

They were regular club members, and Jimmy was so dedicated that she was made a life member.

Pieter died some years ago, and Jimmy moved to the Hollywood village - now called Regis.

In recent years bridge became a huge part of her life - she helped organise and run a small group at Regis and played both at West Coast Bridge Club and the small Village Bridge Club, playing 4 and even 5 times each week. Fiercely independent, she drove herself everywhere.

A keen and astute bridge player, she played until a few days before her death in July, and passed away in the week of her 99th birthday.

Jimmy was a friendly sole, and universally loved - she was open hearted, bright and positive.

She will be sadly missed at the bridge table.



How to Bid Your Game

By Di Brooks

Scrolling through the scores of a club session I note a number of part scores recorded when the declaring side has game on. What's happened to deter the pair with the balance of power from bidding to game or even slam? Let's have a look at different scenarios –

- a/ Opponents have interfered in the bidding or opened a weak two
- b/ Maybe the player miscounted their points
- c/ Was there a glitch in the bidding
- d/ Lack of bridge experience

a/ If the opponents have opened a Multi Two or Weak Two, your choices are

- Bid
- Pass
- or Double

With a strong balanced hand, bid 2NT

If holding their suit and NOT a balanced hand: Pass

If short in the Opener's suit, Double, asking partner to pick a suit

b/ If you have miscounted your points and you have passed, you have to wear the result. Try to concentrate on your counting, no matter what goes on around you, (barring Typhoons and Tsunamis)

If partner opens the bidding, you may try to catch up. Partner may not believe you and you may miss a Grand Slam!!!!

c/ What was the glitch? Did one of you make a bid that was alerted and the wrong bid was made or the wrong explanation given? You cannot take inference from sighs or posture change. You have to reply according to what is your systemic agreement. Wear the result and learn from it.

d/ Lack of bridge experience - Play more. Make mistakes and learn from them. If you have a problem assessing the hands and the replies ask a more experienced pair after the session. I'm sure those of higher rank would be happy to give helpful advice.

When Peg Brady founded the Rockingham Bridge Club she encouraged us to play in other clubs, join the League Teams and go to congresses. We of the class of 1978 did as we were told. How we ever won any teams matches with our lack of experience still amazes me but we did enjoy the challenge.

So now I ask you ... "Are you ready for the Challenge"!

And lastly, whatever the situation enjoy this great game of Contract Bridge.

It's an investment for your future.








Preempts


Close Encounters: Bridge's Greatest Matches - Book 2 Eric Kokish and Mark Horton



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

Test Your Slam Play

By Bill Jacobs

SOLUTION



The 12 tricks you are planning to take are 2 spades, 6 hearts, 1 diamond and 3 clubs. You certainly need to set up the clubs, so if all goes well, you won't need the diamond finesse. Two early club losers can be avoided by using a spade for a club discard in hand.

The threat is in diamonds. If you lose a club trick to West and he then plays a diamond, you will have to finesse. You cannot afford to play the ace, because that is your entry to the established clubs.

To avoid this risk, play low from dummy at trick 1, allowing East to win. Win the (say) spade return, and cash your remaining spade, discarding two little clubs. Now ace of clubs and a club ruff, over to the ♥K, ruff another club, and if the suit divides, smile and claim.

If clubs break 4-1, you will need some luck elsewhere: spades 3-2 and the diamond finesse. You will still be able to establish the clubs for one diamond discard.

The moral: You know what it is. Don't rush to play a card from dummy at trick 1.

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
Double Pay

By Ron Klinger

SOLUTION

If you found the killing lead, you were entitled to double 4H. If not, the double was an unwise decision.

From a Butler Open Trials:



After East opened 1C, you can imagine North's delight at hearing South bid 2NT, hearts and diamonds. What would do with the North cards?

North elected to try for 3NT and South removed to 4H. It is attractive to bid 4H at once over 1C.

North's 3NT bid strongly suggests that North is prepared for a club lead. Perhaps North is not as prepared for a spade lead. There are no guarantees, but the spade lead appeals.

On the actual deal, West needs to lead a spade or the DA and then a spade in order to defeat 4H. East wins the spade and can play a trump. South can cash the CA but then dummy is dead.

In practice, West led the C7. Away went the spade loser on the CA. Declarer continued with a diamond to the jack and ace. When the D9 fell on the second round of diamonds, declarer lost only one heart and two diamonds. That was +790 and +11 Imps against the datum of N-S 240.
