

There have been a some recent modifications and additions to the BAWA Supplementary Regulations, they are listed below.

2010

1. The regulation stating teams with 6 members may not have substitutes has been removed.
2. A new regulation pertaining to the number of substitutes allowed in a particular event has been included. Note: it is identical to the corresponding ABF regulation.

The number of substitutions allowed in any BAWA Event, unless otherwise specifically provided for in the Supplementary Regulations, shall be according to the scale below: A stanza is defined as any number of boards after which there is a break in play as provided for in the Supplementary Regulations.

>7 $0.5n$ (rounded down to the nearest whole number)

3. **Bidding Boxes:** The use of bidding boxes in Gold and Open Red Point events is now a requirement. BAWA has a supply of bidding boxes clubs may borrow, at no cost, for Congress and Open Red Point events. Note: Club red point events, which are restricted to club members, are NOT bound by this regulation.

4. **Bridgemate (Table electronic scorers).** When electronic scorers are in use, no display of comparative scores is permitted. This includes both the board comparative percentage and the list of results from other tables. Note: For club red point events, which are restricted to club members, this regulation becomes a recommendation.

5. All participants in State Events and Congresses must be a member of a BAWA affiliated club and supply their ABF number at the beginning of the tournament. However, BAWA will generally receive sympathetically applications from visiting overseas or interstate players wishing to play in a BAWA event during their time in Western Australia. All participants in BAWA/ABF events must be an active(financial) member of an ABF affiliated club and supply their ABF number at the beginning of the tournament. A player who is inactive at the start of an event is automatically disqualified. Teams / partners may replace the disqualified player but a score penalty will be imposed.

6. Entering a congress entails an obligation to play - failure to turn up at a congress that you have entered, without exceptional and extenuating circumstances, will result in the forfeiture of entry rights to ALL BAWA Sponsored Open Red point events until all outstanding entries fees are paid.
